

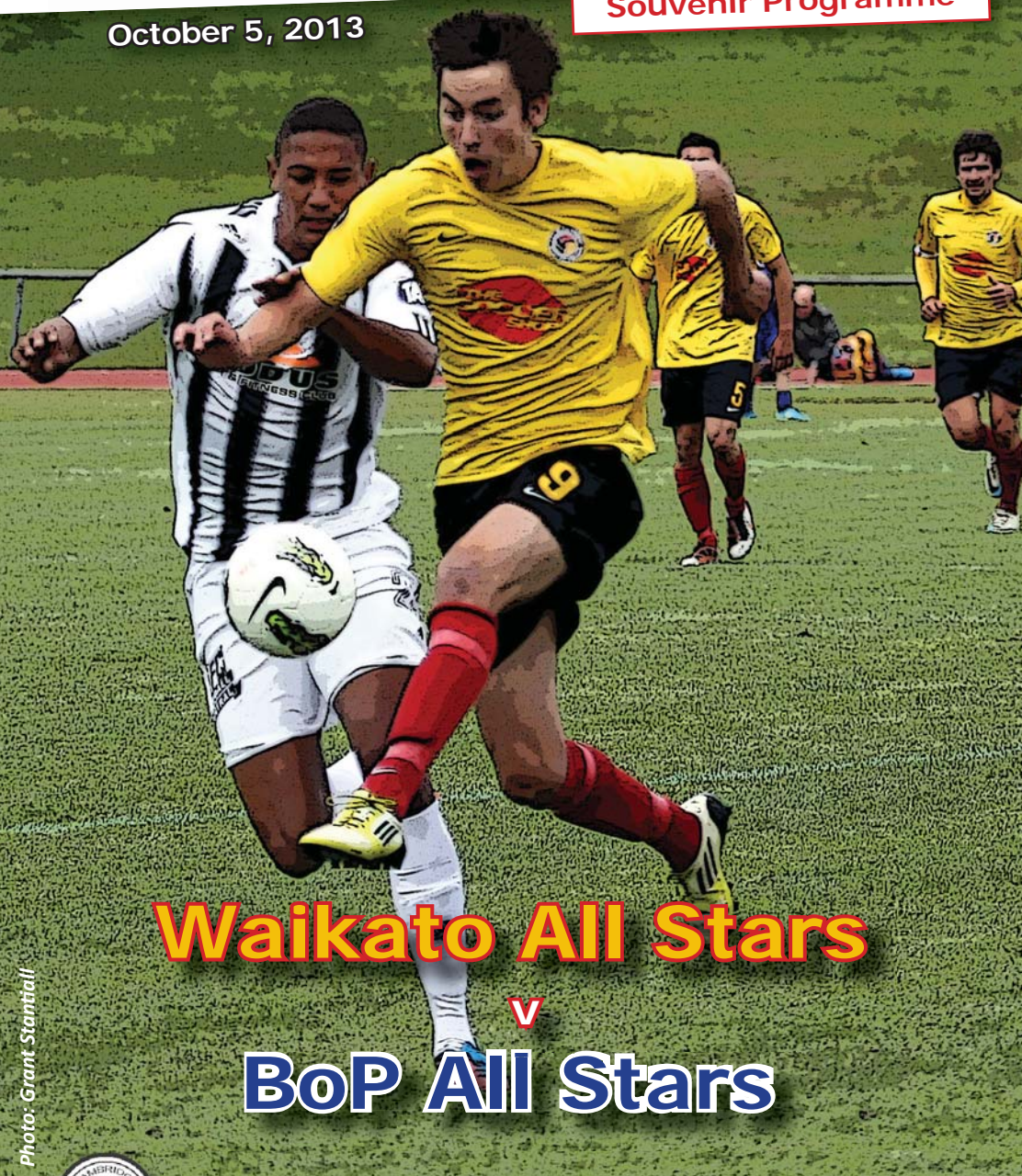

Squad takes shape

WaiBOP United will meet an All Stars selection on Saturday October 12 at John Kerkhof Park.

The game will help coach Peter Smith prepare his side for this season's ASB Premiership competition.

Smith's latest signing is defender Tyler Lissette.

Hamilton-born Lissette took the field for Waikato FC during the 2011-12 ASB Premiership season. He was part of Waikato FC's 2012-13 squad but never made it onto the field due to injury. Lissette played for Team Wellington during the 2010-11 season.

Now 22, Lissette has already made more than twenty ASB Premiership appearances in his career, including a couple of play-off matches during his time with Team Wellington. He can play in either the centre of defensive or a holding midfield role.

Smith said: "Tyler will add strength and balance to our defensive stocks. It's

important we get our defensive shape and organisation right and with Tyler in the mix, alongside the other players we've signed, I think we start with a good chance of achieving that."

Other players signed include All White Aaron Scott, goalkeeper Andy McNeil (Livingston, Scotland), Liam

Higgins (Noble Park Utd of Melbourne & NZ U20) Mark Jones, Raymond How, Johnny Konings and Adam Luque (Hamilton Wanderers), Scott Hilliar (Melville United), Maksim Manko (Bay Olympic), Milos Nikolic (Central United), Jack McNab and Josh Nelson (Tauranga City United).

Despite signing for United in July, Federico Marquez (Ngaruawahia United) recently asked to be released from his agreement. WaiBOP United reluctantly accepted his request for a release and he will turn out this season for Canterbury United.

ASB Premiership

Venues announced for United's home games

Three stadiums across the Waikato and Bay of Plenty region will play host to WaiBOP United during the 2013/14 ASB Premiership campaign.

WaiBOP United's primary home base for the season will be Hamilton's Beetham Park, which is tucked neatly in behind Waikato Stadium. The franchise will also play two home matches in the Bay of Plenty, with games set for Rotorua International Stadium and Links Ave Stadium, Mt Maunganui.

WaiBOP United host their opening match of the ASB Premiership season when they play Canterbury United at Rotorua International Stadium on Sunday November 10. This match will be the second half of a double header on opening day. Earlier on the same day WaiBOP Football is set to play Mainland Football in the ASB National Women's League. This will allow fans to take in two quality matches on a day that showcases football in this region.

The first home game at Beetham Park will be played on Saturday November 23 when WaiBOP United hosts Hawke's Bay United.

WaiBOP Football's Acting CEO, Peter Arndell, said Beetham Park was chosen out of necessity.

"We wanted a central Hamilton venue for the bulk of our home games and Beetham Park fits the bill," explains Arndell. "The surface is good and it's an easy venue to get to, with plenty of parking. Once we've set it up with seating, sponsors facilities and other amenities it will be a nice, tight, atmospheric little ground."

Links Ave Stadium in Mt Maunganui will host a unique double header on February 1, 2014.

The ASB Premiership match between WaiBOP United and newcomers Juniors SC (the New Zealand Under-20s) will be the main game, while the curtain-raiser will see WaiBOP United's Youth team host the New Zealand Under-17 side. This will be a great opportunity to watch some of the best youth talent in New Zealand.

New team, new beginning

The curtain is about to rise for the country's newest national league side, WaiBOP United.

The squad makes its first public appearance at Cambridge's John Kerkhof Park next Saturday (Oct 12) when they meet a team selected from this weekend's WaiBOP All Stars game.

It'll be an early opportunity for supporters to check out the signings by head coach Peter Smith who has begun an intensive seven-week pre-season preparation with his players.

Smith has broken his pre-season period into two distinct parts. The first four weeks will see him working with a wider training squad that includes not only the players he's already signed but also a large number of trialists. During

the first week of training Smith and his coaching staff have worked with between 25 and 30 players per session

"We've cast our net pretty wide and have uncovered some interesting prospects," explains Smith.

"It's important we have a good look at everyone, both in the training environment and also in a match situation. I need to make sure we have the right mix of players in the squad, both in terms of ability and attitude, so this period is critical."

"By the time we've finished with the match in Cambridge I'll have a very good idea who will be playing for WaiBOP United this season. I'll then name a squad of 20 players and we'll head to

Auckland for a weekend training camp."
